- Early entry into production.

- 2º leaf > 1 kg olives/tree
- 3º leaf > 5 kg olive/tree
- Compact growing habit.

- Less cost in pruning
- Low vigor.

- 20-40 % less than Arbequina
- Reduction in the planting distances: 3,5 x 1m.
- Fruit's size similar to Arbequina.

- Weight 1.3 - 1.9 gr.
- Ripening time medium:

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- Between Arbequina and Arbosana
- Good oil yield:

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- 14 to 21% oil - 40 to 47% oil in dry matter IM: 1.5 - 2.8
- Very high productivity, without alternance
- Medium tolerance to Peacock spot (*Spilocaea oleagina*).
